

## Recyclable Guidelines for MPSC Materials

<u>Material</u>	<u>Description/Examples</u>
Milk Jugs:	cloudy/creamy/foggy white jugs with screw caps Examples: 4-litre milk jugs.
#1 PETE:	most #1 bottles, clear or green only (no caps) Examples: soft drink bottles
Aluminium:	drinking cans Examples: soft drink cans, beer cans
Steel:	steel cans (rinsed - labels are okay) Examples: soup cans, food cans, coffee cans (remove plastic lid)
Boxboard	a light single-layer type of cardboard, often coloured/printed Examples: cereal boxes, toilet paper rolls, soft drink boxes
Milk cartons:	gable top or brick-shaped containers. Examples: milk cartons, juice boxes (tetra packs)
Cardboard:	corrugated cardboard Examples: all packing boxes, large boxes
Newspaper:	newsprint Examples: newspaper, flyers, junk mail, magazines Phone books/magazines white or coloured paper (with no carbon paper or glue) Examples: shredded paper, bond paper
Glass	glass bottles Examples: liquor bottles, jars

### These items must go to the Landfill

plastic bags, cloth/clothing, very dirty items, some #1 plastics, all #3 plastics, all #6 plastics, plastics not on other lists (see below)  
Examples: #1 dark food trays, #1 brown/blue/cloudy bottles, #6 clear cake covers, #6 muffin holders, #6 food trays from fast food restaurants, #6 Styrofoam

### These items are no longer accepted as Recycling

Mixed Plastics: assortment of #2, #4, #5 & #7 plastics, usually cloudy/coloured plastic (often called "2 & 5")  
Examples: margarine tubs & lids, laundry detergent containers, ketchup bottles, ice cream pails
